



IB Diploma Requirements



- Total 6 subjects (each subject taken for 2 years)
 - o 3 at Higher Level
 - o 3 at Standard Level
- Theory of Knowledge
- Extended Essay
- CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service)
- Character Education



Enriched Pathways Requirements



- Minimum 5 subject per year:
 - o IB Courses: Standard Level or Higher Level
 - IB Credit (2 year final exam)
 - Provincial Courses through online providers
 - o Non-IB credit subjects could be different from G11-G12
- Theory of Knowledge (G11 mandatory, G12 optional)
- Extended Essay (IB Credit / Provincial Credit)
- CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service)
- Character Education / Careers Life Connections



Guiding Principles for Course Selection



- Appropriate challenge not unnecessary stress
- Play to your strengths
- Focus on the holistic experience, not strategics
- Student interest
- Teacher guidance
- Math & Languages teacher directed
- University requirements
- **Important:** Mulgrave philosophy of holistic education encouraging students to take courses in all subject areas (with some exceptions).

Importance of the Arts

- Every student needs to take an Art (exception: university courses that require two sciences)
- Universities encourage and favour a liberal arts approach
- Art is an universal language that enhances communication, creative thinking, risk-tasking, collaboration, confidence and mental health
- Skills-based courses (rather than knowledge based)
