


# Grade 11 (12) Post-Secondary Planning Info Session 2024

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## The Post-Secondary Guidance Process

- Regular meetings with post-secondary team, both individually + group to discuss plans for the future
- Group sessions occur in Character Education classes, before school, lunch, and after school
- Provide holistic support (extracurricular planning, academic goal setting, applications, deferral, gap year, etc.)



## The Post-Secondary Guidance Process con't

- Research and gather information on options for the future (continuing on from your University Research Project in Character Education 11):
  - <u>Tour</u> universities
  - Attend university fairs, presentations/visits
  - Speak to family members, friends, university alumnus, and teachers for their perspectives.
  - Do research, including <u>exploring university websites.</u>
  - Review your list of features for <u>"best fit"</u> university.



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#### What to consider for "best fit"?

- Class size, campus size, student population
- Size and location of town urban, suburban, rural?
- Undergrad vs. comp/large univ?
- Close to family? Far, far, far away?
- Climate? Geography?
- Are specific facilities important to me?
- Pursuit of athletics?
- Scholarship opportunities? Financial Aid? Net cost?
- Study Abroad programme?
- Co-op/work experience/internship?





# <u>Timeline</u> (Remainder of G11)

- Spring continue your research on areas of interests, and best fit universities
  - April attend UCCD led Character Ed sessions (including essay writing workshops)
  - April attend university visits/fairs, tours
  - May/June finalise your university and programme list with your family and counsellor. Select teachers for references and request prior to summer (e.g. USA ED/EA prior to summer holidays you need to complete form)
- Determine what your application criteria
- Begin drafting required essays (for UK and USA) and request counsellor edits
- Meet with your counsellor (like voting early and often!)
- Consider a <u>gap year</u>: renew, refresh, refocus and universities look favorably on gap year students!!



## Timeline (Fall Grade 12)

- Attend university presentations/fairs
- Begin university applications
  - Canada: most application sites open by early October
  - UK: all applications submitted through UCAS (opens in May but cannot submit until Sept, Oxbridge deadline Oct.)
  - USA: most applications submitted through Common Application
- Important Dates
  - UK Oxbridge/St.Andrews/Medicine, USA UNC EA Deadline: Oct 3
  - USA Early Deadline: Oct 15\*
  - USA University of California Deadline: Nov 20
  - <u>All</u> university applications deadline: Dec 9

\* Note that these are "general" in-house deadlines. Some universities may have earlier ED/EA deadlines that need to be considered.



### Timeline (Fall/Winter G12)

- Complete all components of university applications including any necessary supplements
  - Example: Engineering, Business, Nursing, portfolio + audition, UBC require supplemental essays and videos.
- Apply for scholarships
  - Automatic Entrance Scholarships
  - University-based Scholarships with applications
  - Nomination Scholarships <u>In-School Application</u> <u>package</u>
  - External scholarships not affiliated to a university



# Applying to University



<u>Canada:</u>

- Majority of universities have individual applications, most cost roughly \$100 per application, open in October
- Various application sites: OUAC, ApplyBC, ApplyAlberta, etc.
- Supplements may be required (e.g. UBC, professional faculties)

<u>United Kingdom:</u>

- <u>UCAS</u> application site (*buzzword to come from Mulgrave*)
- Required: Personal Statement related to field of study
- Oxford, Cambridge, Medicine, Law)
  - Admissions Tests required. Can only apply to Oxford <u>or</u> Cambridge - not both!
- Reference joint letter from teachers and counsellors speak to your counsellor and teachers (discussion not letter request)
- Maximum number is five UK universities
- Offers of Admissions Conditional



# Applying con't...

**United States:** 

- Very detailed and time consuming process (i.e.10 hours each)
- Maximum number is <u>7 US universities</u>
- Essential to attend presentations and fairs, meet with visiting admissions representatives
- Application Site <u>Common Application</u> (most widely known and used), <u>Coalition App</u>, <u>U of California system</u> is separate
- Essays are <u>very important</u>!
  - <u>Common App essays for 2023-24 are available</u>.
  - $\circ$  Essays for 2024-25 are not yet available.
- SAT/ACT Exam Scores: remember to register for the tests EARLY and send your scores to your universities
- Applications reviewed holistically.

# Applying con't...



#### United States (con't):

Essentials application components:

- 1. Academic performance + rigour of programme.
- 2. Personal essays and statements
- 3. Academic references (usually two)
- 4. Counsellor written evaluation
- 5. Extra-curricular / Leadership involvement
- 6. Standardised test scores (SAT/ACT) keep in mind, scores are usually weighted less for international students. Not all universities require them. Test Optional Colleges Listing -<u>www.fairtest.org</u>
- 7. Optional portfolios (if available)

Most universities are currently test-optional. Notable exceptions (requiring testing) include: Dartmouth, Yale, MIT, Georgetown, public universities in Florida and Georgia; and Bryn Mawr (for int'l applicants)



#### Transcripts and Anticipated Grades

- Two official documents are sent to most universities:
  - IB Anticipated Grades Transcript
  - Mulgrave Transcript (G9-12 courses & % marks)
- Delivery Methods:
  - Electronic (when available)
    - UK UCAS
    - USA Common App as a school package
  - Posted by mail (using Canada Post)
  - Self-reporting *ie. UT, McGill, UAlberta, SFU, UVic, UToronto*
- Students must request transcripts through <u>Naviance Student</u> for all <u>Canadian universities</u>.

#### **Reference Letters**



What is the process for requesting reference letters?

- 1. Student and Counsellor meet to discuss applications, goals and which referees would be the best choice.
- Students need to personally ask teacher(s) for the reference letter. You are required to provide teachers <u>three weeks'</u> notice (min)\*.
- 3. Complete <u>teacher reference form</u> to the best of your abilities with comprehensive responses.
- 4. Complete <u>counsellor reference form</u>
- Reference letters and transcripts sent by Mulgrave
  \*Thanking your teachers is a necessity. A 'thank you' card would be greatly appreciated.

\* We are recommending that students give their teachers/counsellors completed forms by the end of June 2024

## Acceptances and Deciding



General: all offers of admissions are <u>conditional</u>.

- Respond by May 1 (or university dependent\*\*).
  - Some university admission + scholarship offers will have earlier deadlines \*\*Please check dates on university portal carefully .

Canada:

- Most universities "rolling" admissions
  UBC offers issued by end of April
- Majority of offers January-March, but professional (supplement and portfolio based admissions take longer)

United Kingdom:

- Most are "Rolling" admissions/offers
- Can only accept 2 offers "firm" and "insurance" (May) United States:
- Early offers available mid-December.
- Early Decision II in January-mid-February.
- Regular offers released March onward.
